# Chuck's Column

In our highly charged and volatile partisan political, religious, and social environment today it is perhaps unavoidable that at some point we will be offended by or that we will offend a family member, friend, or co-worker. This is why forgiveness is so important. As you know the writings of Richard Rohr have played a key part in my Christian discipleship. Here is what he says about forgiveness:

"Even with all the best intentions in the world, given our different temperaments, backgrounds, and the way we process our data and information, we are going to step on one another's toes. Two people with absolutely good will can deeply hurt one another. Good people hurt one another because we all come at reality in different ways. That's why, for Jesus, the only way to achieve union [with God and one another] is through forgiveness, not through making sin impossible. . . . Jesus says the only way to achieve union is through failure, vulnerability, and repair – because people are always going to hurt one another. . . . The same Spirit [that was at work in Jesus and all the great saints] is at work freeing you . . . and you are learning both to receive and grant a universal forgiveness. This is the sum and substance of Jesus' teaching. If you don't 'get' forgiveness, you don't get the core message."

This past Sunday I talked about what we can learn from being offended, that if we turn our offense inward we can learn and grow from it. Maybe the giving and receiving of forgiveness is the greater lesson.


### **Successful Mission Trip**

We had a great Mission Trip to Zambia. Working in Munyanya village with Lonnie and Fran Turner we did both construction work and activities with kids of all ages. The work with kids included games, singing, crafts and sports. The sports activities included soccer, Tee ball, track, and basketball. On the construction side, several of us worked on the nursing station/clinic and the foundation for the structure to hold a new water tank for the village. One highlight was several of us going in dugout canoes up the Zambezi River to the island villages to distribute tooth brushes and tooth paste, jump ropes, and sports equipment. Thanks to the Sutton family and the Formans for the giving of their time and their enthusiastic participation and support of the mission activities in the village. I'm sure anyone of them would be happy to share about their experience working in Munyanya Village.

If you would like to support the work of the Turners and their Partners in Development organization, simply write a check to IBC and designate the funds for Project Samuel-Partners in Development. You can even designate funds for a specific project. The current project list includes the following:

- 1. Completion of the Water Project \$2,000
- (This project has been funded by the Formans)
- 2. Complete filling the Container and shipping it to Zambia. (Funds have been donated to cover the shipping cost. Need a few more items to completely fill the container.)
- 3. Basketball Court \$10,000
- 4. Complete Nursing and Doctor Station/Clinic \$15,000 (Funds are needed to complete the walls, roof, windows, doors, and plumbing.)
- 5. Solar Installation \$5,000
- 6. School fees for nursing students \$2,000 per student per year
